#### Organization Description and Mission:

**Description:** The Duval County Health Department Family Planning Program Services addresses the Duval County Community addresses teen pregnancy prevention and family planning services from a male perspective. The **Reaching Our Young Men** program provides pregnancy prevention education and family planning program services along with expertise to the Jacksonville community regarding program planning, program development and special initiatives.

Through the **Reaching our Young Men** program, Family Planning Health Education and Health Screening services are provided to teen / young adult males at identified service locations. This is completed through onsite health education sessions (e.g., pregnancy prevention, STD / STI and HIV prevention education, abstinence education and counseling), in targeted male-focused after school and community-based settings (i.e., the Edward Waters College Black male Explorers Program) and through limited health screenings (for STDs, HIV, men's health services, etc.) to this population, in identified clinical or non-traditional community settings. In addition, there referrals to DCHD clinics are made as needed. The program also addresses comprehensive family planning and other health needs of these individuals through targeted outreach to hard-to-reach / vulnerable populations by partnering with local agencies.

**Mission:** Promote, protect, and improve the health of all people in Greater Jacksonville, Florida.

## **II. Service Description**

### ***First quarter goals:***

Member will shadow site mentor to learn about program activities, education presentation materials and standards, and the essence of delivering presentations to targeted populations. The member will also develop questionnaires and produce group activities to assist with the assessment of the perceived access to and awareness of family planning services. Member will also conduct research (gather statistics) regarding males and family planning. Additionally, the member will complete the online Centers for Disease Control and Prevention developed STD and HIV education modules, the Reaching Our Young Men Health Advocate Training. Member will begin facilitation of health education sessions. Member will participate in at least 2 community health fairs. The member will conduct at least two (2) educational sessions per week at one of the program sites, utilizing information gained via research, focus groups, and training.

### ***Second quarter goals:***

Member will implement teen product development sessions to obtain input from teen populations about their attitude / knowledge regarding teen health issues as they relate to their culture. Member will schedule and attend HIV 501 training and Rapid HIV testing training. Member will facilitate first focus group and present results to the Family Planning Program Services staff. Member will participate in 2 community health fairs. The member will conduct at least two (2) educational sessions per week at one of the program sites, utilizing information gained via research, focus groups, and training.

### ***Third quarter goals:***

Member will work with Site Mentor in leading community discussion groups to collect information about teen male health issues and how to reach and educate the teen population regarding family planning/ reproductive health. The member will conduct at least three (3) educational sessions per week at one of the program sites, utilizing information gained via research, focus groups, and training. Member will participate in 2 community health fairs. Member will participate in 2 community health fairs.

### ***Fourth quarter goals:***

Present and display teen products (to include education and community marketing materials), to present in various community settings / public settings. Member will participate in 3 community health fairs. The member will conduct at least three (3) educational sessions per week at one of the program sites, utilizing information gained via research, focus groups, and training.

Outcome Measures:

**First quarter:**

The outcomes measuring the impact the member will have for the first quarter are:

1. Development of a family planning questionnaire to assess the perceived access and awareness of family planning services.
2. Group activities developed to assist in the increase the awareness and knowledge of family planning services.
3. Completion of CDC and Reaching Our Young Men Education training.
4. Participation in health/education fairs.
5. The number of completed education sessions.

**Second quarter:**

The outcomes measuring the impact the member will have for the second quarter are:

1. Completed, developed products designed to obtain the attitude of teen/ young men regarding health issues.
2. Completion of HIV 500/501 training as offered by the Florida Department of Health.
3. Facilitation of focus groups.
4. Participation in health/ education fairs.
5. The number of completed education sessions.

**Third quarter:**

The outcomes measuring the impact the member will have for the third quarter are:

1. Conduction of discussion groups to collect information from teen/ young males regarding health issues and how to best reach the young population.
2. The number of completed education sessions.
3. Number of health/ education fairs participated in.

**Fourth quarter:**

The outcomes measuring the impact the member will have for the third quarter are:

1. Completion of marketing materials.
2. The number of completed education sessions.
3. Number of health/ education fairs participated in.

The experience with **Reaching Our Young Men**, under the supervision and direction of the program mentor, will provide the member with examples of and opportunities to develop create and improve the following skills:

1. Professionalism: Through interactions with the site mentor, DCHD staff, and partner organizations the member will learn how to communicate and interact professionally through written and verbal methods. The member will also be oriented to the professional dress expectations of the DCHD and the **Reaching Our Young Men** program partners.
2. Communication: In addition to the written and verbal interactions described in the professionalism description, the member will develop and improve his or her written, oral, and presentation techniques

through the **Reaching Our Young Men** Program. The staple of the program is health education presentation. The member will develop, assess, and modify written health education information to deliver to our program partners. In addition, the member will develop written materials including letters, memos, and emails to communicate with program staff and partners. The member will also develop oral and power-point type presentations.

3. Program Development: The member will be provided opportunities to enhance program activities through program development. The member will have access to past program implementations and initiatives providing the opportunity for the member to evaluate their effectiveness. This evaluation will assist the member in development of new program initiatives while also strengthening current initiatives.
4. Outreach Principles: Part of the **Reaching Our Young Men** Program consists of targeted Family Planning Outreach. The member will learn the skills of targeted outreach through working with partnering organizations to participate in health fairs.
5. Evaluation: The member will participate in program activities that will provide experience in both qualitative and quantitative evaluation. The member will develop, implement, and assess outcome evaluations, process evaluations, customer satisfaction through the development of evaluation tools including focus group question development.
6. HIV/ AIDS and Domestic Violence Counseling: The member will participate in HIV 500/501 Training which provides the skills needed for HIV/AIDS counseling and domestic violence counseling. Upon receipt of certification, the member will further develop these skills through providing HIV Rapid Screening to various program implementation sites.
